The Broadband Initial Inquiry Form provides Idaho Power basic information to determine our next steps. Idaho Power will contact you within seven business days of receiving the form.

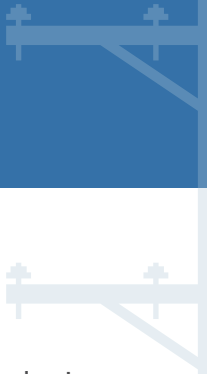




Things to Keep in Mind:

- Network owners will need to execute a Facilities Attachment Agreement and meet all bonding and insurance requirements in order to occupy space on or use Idaho Power's equipment. To begin this process, email jointusedept@idahopower.com.
 - As a network owner, you will be responsible for application and annual fees for use of Idaho Power equipment.
 - Modifications to Idaho Power equipment might be required before attaching telecommunications equipment. Network owners are responsible for any project-related engineering, design and make-ready costs for their attachments.

- Network owners are responsible for meeting Idaho Power's Joint Use Construction Standards and for maintaining attachments safely and in accordance with Idaho Power's requirements. Idaho Power conducts regular inspections to ensure all standards and codes are met. Modifications might be required at the expense of the network owner in case of a safety or code violation.
 - Idaho Power does not allow telecommunications equipment on transmission poles. Attachment to transmission poles with distribution under-build is allowed in some circumstances.
 - Idaho Power is experiencing an increased number of applications for telecommunications equipment which may impact processing timelines. Visit idahopower.com/jointuse for current timelines to process new applications.
