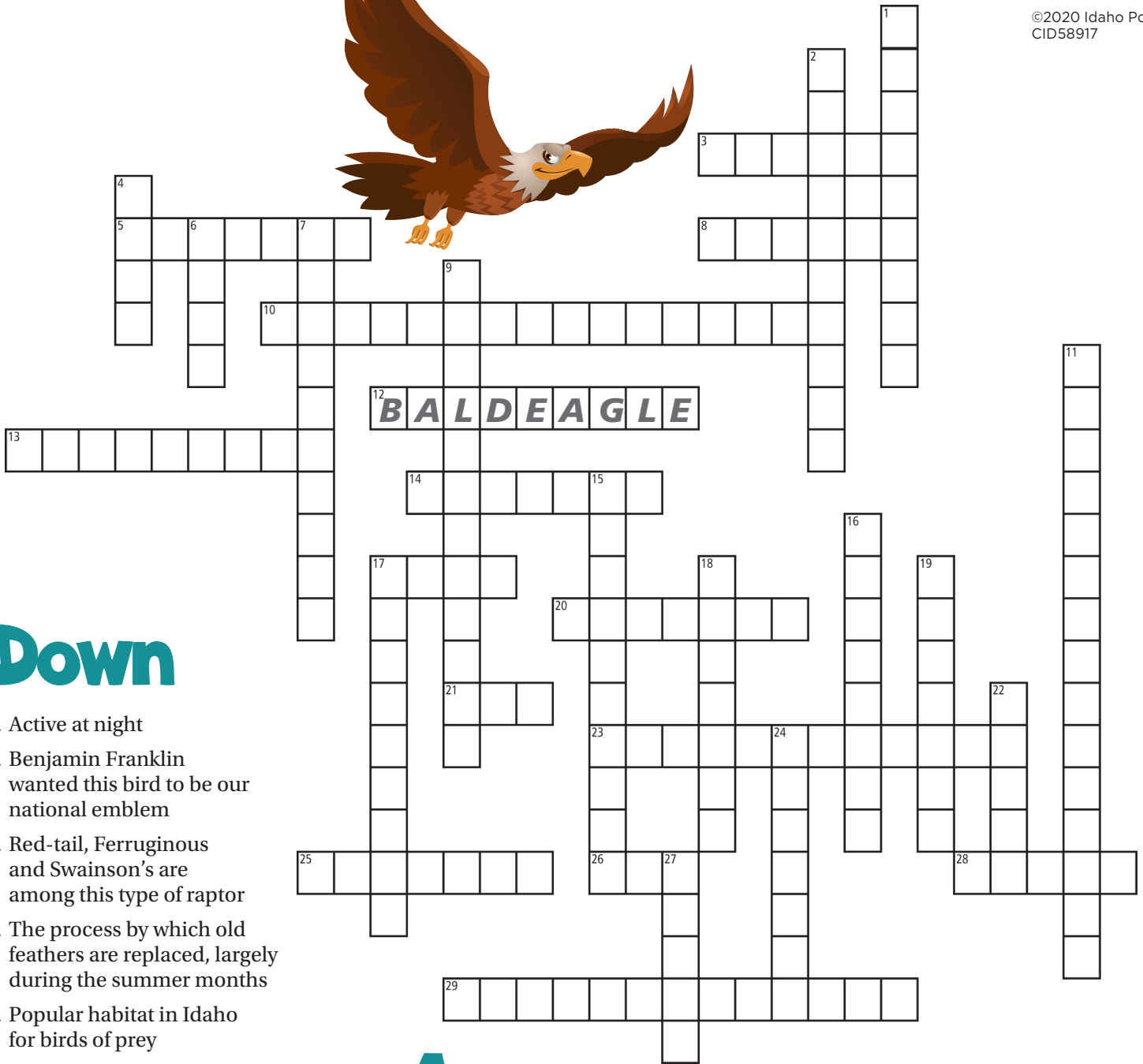
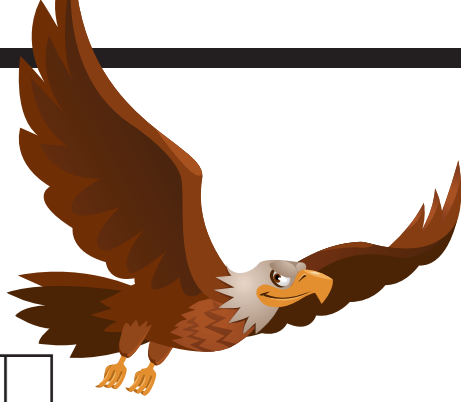
There are five major families of birds of prey, and each family has both a scientific or Latin family name as well as a common English family name. Can you draw a line to connect the two?
