## **9:32 A.M. Welcome & Announcements—Quentin Nesbitt**

Quentin opened the meeting with members and presenter's introductions then discussed the proposed Oregon Trail Electric Cooperative sale stating the filing will have a detailed transition plan that will include both DR and EE.

### **Discussion**

One member asked about the timing of the filing. Riley answered that the company is going to try and have the filing submitted by the end of April, but that it could extend into May. He advised that at this time, there is no absolute date.

## **9:39 A.M. YTD Financials & Savings—Quentin Nesbitt**

Quentin presented the 2025 portfolio highlights, savings & expenses, and 2004-2025 DR. He then discussed the DSM program incentives by type and sector and the evaluations schedule.

## **9:47 A.M. Residential Programs—Billie McWinn**

Billie presented the 2025 residential program highlights, programs the company is focusing on, and gave marketing updates.

### **Discussion**

One member asked about the Rebate Advantage program and why the company suspended it. Billie answered that the company utilizes costs and savings as determined by the RTF for many programs and measures and noted that last year the baseline for the savings associated with manufactured homes had changed. Billie also stated that the RTF identified that manufacturers were building to the efficiency standard and determined that manufacturers were almost building to the efficiency when calculating cost-effectiveness.

## **10:11 A.M. Commercial, Industrial, & Irrigation Programs—Chellie Jensen**

Chellie shared the top five highlights for commercial, industrial, and irrigation programs in 2025. She presented the overall and individual program savings for the CI&I sectors. Chellie

then went over the BOMA sponsorship, presented recent marketing ads and demand response outreach efforts for both commercial/industrial and irrigation sectors.

Quentin noted that until the conclusion of that proceeding, it will be business as usual for the company, including the scheduling of future EEAG meetings.
